




# WILKINS PEAK



This peak was named after a member of John Wesley Powell's survey team while making their first expedition down the Green River. The peak also has its own distinct segment of the Green River Geological Formation which is known as the Wilkins Peak Formation.



Wildlife on and around Wilkins Peak includes Pronghorn antelope, eagles, mule deer, Greater sage-grouse, songbirds, badgers, bull snakes, lizards, cottontail rabbits, and hawks. Be careful if you turn any rocks over, there might be a scorpion underneath! In late spring and early summer you can find a variety of blooming wildflowers including Indian Paintbrush.



The peak is primarily used for radio and television station transmitters but it also serves radio needs of the FAA, EMS, and local businesses such as Dominion Energy. These towers are located on private land are not accessible to the public.
